Circle Up

Read the Bible



Say: Today we are going to read John 4:1-26. While we are reading the Bible, I want you to listen for the words "water" and "drink." Everytime you hear the word *water* or *drink*, I want you to make a cup out of your hands.

Directions: Read the story. Try reading the story in a different voice and pause when you say the words "water" or "drink" to allow kids to make the hand motion to match.

Draw it Out

Materials: Paper and something to draw

Say: Today we're going to draw the story we just heard. Let's see how many things from our story we can include in the picture. For instance we can include:

- Jesus
 - The Woman
 - The well
 - Words that they both said to each other

Materials: Paper and marker

Directions: Write the memory verse (several words at a time) on several pieces of paper. Take the papers outside and lay them out in a row. Jump, skip, or hop on one leg to each paper. Once you get to the paper, say that part of the verse.

To make it more challenging, spread the papers further out.
